



2017 ProSPER.Net Young Researchers' School

'Water Security for Sustainable Development in a Changing Climate'

International University – Viet Nam National University Ho Chi Minh City Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam 6 to 15 March, 2017

General description:

The aim of the 2017 ProSPER.Net Young Researcher's School is to offer PhD students in the network an opportunity to engage with issues related to water security as it relates to sustainable development, while developing research skills and communication strategies, and encouraging future professionals to work within the field of sustainable development.

The programme provides the following:

- Knowledge and training regarding water security issues under climate change scenarios;
- Opportunities for research skills development, including research communication through activities such as the 3-minute thesis competition¹ and a research communications skills workshop. The aim is to help students frame their research to reach broader audiences;
- Interaction among participants and resource persons through group activities and field trips will provide context and content for students to develop a research proposal.
- An opportunity to develop an applied research proposal with the aim of helping address
 water security issues within the region. This proposal will look at how different policies and
 projects can be interlinked and provide integrative solutions for various sustainable
 development challenges.
- Resource persons' lectures and workshops, which will be split between introductory and methodological themes prior to the fieldtrips and analytical/synthesizing themes after the fieldtrips to help develop each research proposal. Resource persons will include experts in each field both from Vietnam and abroad.

Practical considerations:

Participants will arrive on March 5th and depart on March 16th.

¹ The 3-minute thesis competition is an activity where researchers present an outline of their research in three minutes using 1 slide. Aimed at an educated but non-specialist audience the thesis will be graded according to three criteria: clarity of presentation, comprehension and the engaging nature of the research.

- Programme activities will typically start from 8am and end at 4pm, with the exception of field trip days where the start and closing time of activities will be subject to change.
- There are two sessions in each morning and afternoon period. A 15 minute break will take place between most activities.
- A core team of 4-5 resource persons shall participate in the entire programme, to coordinate
 activities, facilitate group work sessions and take the responsibility of any decisions during
 the delivery of the researchers' school.
- In view of previous years' experience, lecture slots are scheduled for 90 minutes in total including presentation, questions and general discussions.
- Research proposals will be developed by the local host to address sustainable development challenges in the region, and participants will be asked to choose from one of four proposals on arrival.
- Group work and discussion in conjunction with the lectures will allow participants to interact with lecturers and resources persons.
- The field trips are scheduled around water security under climate change scenarios. These
 field trips will include visits to the flood prevention infrastructure in Ho Chi Minh City, and
 the Mekong Delta.
